#### CIRCULARS.

As soon as possible on my return from Galveston I issued a circular recommended by the Grand Chapter, explaining the aims and purposes of the Order. I found that these circulars were a step in the right direction. They have saved me a great deal of time and expense, as, besides giving the aims and purposes, they fully explained how to proceed in the organization of a Chapter.

On January 15, 1905, I instructed the Grand Secretary to issue the

following circular letter, which explains itself;

" January 15, 1905.

"To all Worthy Matrons of the Chapters of the O. E. S. of Texas, Greeting: "You are hereby requested to have the new Constitution of our Order

(which has been sent you) read in open Chapter, beginning at your next regular meeting, and to be continued at least once every three months. until all the members of your Chapter shall become familiar with the same.

"Grand Secretary."

My object in doing this, was to do away with a great many unnecessary questions asked by Chapters, and satisfactory results were obtained frein it.

The following letter from the Most Worthy Grand Matron, Madeleine B. Conkling, was received on February 22, 1905. Also my answer to the same, which I submit for the approval of the Grand Chapter:

"OKLAHOMA, OKLA., Feb. 20, 1905.

"Augus Hevells , Grand Motton O. E. S., Dallas, Texas,

"Dear Sister - It has been decided to continue the custom heretofore followed, and establish O. E. S. hemlquarters at Portland, Oregon, during the Lewis and Clark Exposition, which opens June 1, 1965,

"As the time is limited, I have adopted the following plan as the best suited to facilitate matters. An Executive Board has been chosen to

take charge of all arrangements, as follows:

"Margaret Lutke, President Oregon.
"Hattie E. Ewing, Vice President Massachusetts. 

"Mary C. Spedden, Kansas,

"Nettie Ransford, Illinois, Auditing Committee. "Ida M. Lewis, Oklahoma,

"W. F. Kuhn, M. W. G. P. and Madeleine B. Conkling, M. W. G. M.,

ex-othero members, acting advisory.

"All money to be sent direct to the Grand Secretary of each State; from them to Lorraine J. Pitkin, thence to Sister Ercanbrack. Sister Pitkin once each month will publish in the Star periodicals a statement of the receipts. This will be her official receipt, thus saving time and expense. The money thus collected will be subject to the personal check of Margaret Lutke, President of the Board. All bills will be audited by the committee before being paid by the President.

"At this late bour there is no time to spare in waiting to receive your assurance of help, or your approval of the methods adopted; but if for any reason you do not see your way clear to co-operate, or to uree your jurisdiction to lend a helping hand, and respond to the call for financial aid, do not hesitate to say so.

"Sufficient number of circular letters to supply all of your subordinate Chapters will be forwarded from the printer direct to your Grand Secretary for distribution. These letters set forth the fact of establishing the headquarters at Portland, Oregon, and ask for financial aid; they are signed by Brother Kuhn, M. W. G. P., Sister Pitkin, R. W. Grand Secretary, and myself. At the close of each letter is a brief note addressed to the subordinate Chapters of your jurisdiction, urging them to lend a helping hand and instructing them to send their money direct to your own Grand Secretary. This note is signed by you and your Grand Sec-

"Immediately upon receipt of this letter please write to your Grand Secretary, advising her what to do with the circular letters, as they are

sent subject to your orders.

"There is a balance of about \$1,000 from the St. Louis Fraternal Fund, which belongs to the several Grand Chapters to be pro-rated, being about twenty per cent of the amount donated. Many of the States have signified their willingness to turn over to the Oregon fund their share of this amount. Due credit will be given each State for this amount, and the immediate use of this money will enable us to proceed at once with the arrangements, which will otherwise be greatly hindered,

"May we have your consent to keep and use this balance belonging to your Grand Chapter? This proposition was suggested by the offer of a number of Grand Matrons, assuring us that their Grand Chapters

would heartily approve their action.

"Please send me your photo, the best you can get, with your State written at the top, and your own name and address at the bottom. 1 want the picture of every Grand Matron in the world to use in the room decoration at Portland.

"Answer immediately as to the keeping of the balance to your credit. "Now, dear sister, I do carnestly hope you will join with me, heart and hand, to make this undertaking the grandest success possible. I can simply do nothing further in the matter until I hear from you, so I beg you to be prompt.

carefully noted; but before answering it I deemed it necessary to consult our Grand Patron, and accordingly sent him your letter.

"After duly thinking the matter over, we came to the conclusion that it would not be advisable to tax our subordinate Chapters for the Lewis and Clark Exposition, as they have all they can do, and could not afford

"As to the pro rata belonging to the Grand Chapter, left from the St. Louis Fraternal Fund, I willingly assume the responsibility of donating it to the Oregon fund. Our Grand Chapter meets in October, and I hardly think that its members would not sanction the action of their Grand Matron in this matter.

"Wishing you success, I beg to remain, "Fraternally yours,

On May 1, 1905, I received from the M. W. Grand Matron and Patron, Sister Madelcine B. Conkling and Brother William F. Kuhn, the following known as Official Circular No. 1:

#### "GENERAL GRAND CHAPTER, ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR.

"Office of M. W. Grand Matron.

"Opticial Circular No. 1.

"OKLAHOMA CITY, O. T., April 15, 1905.

"To the Grand Matron, Grand Patron and Members of the Grand Chapters under the General Grand Chapter, O. E. S.:

"DEAR SISTERS AND BROTHERS-It is the sincere desire of the M. W. Grand Officers of the General Grand Chapter to do all within our power to promote the welfare of the Order, in extending its borders, its influence, its aims, and in binding together the Grand Chapters as component parts of one great army, a solid indissoluble host, working in harmony, in unity, for one end,

"With these aims in view, we come to you, not as unreasonable dictators, but as your servants, who for a brief period have been called to conduct the affairs of the Order for the good of all.

"The General Grand Chapter is clothed with well-defined powers, beyond which we do not desire to pass. Three of these powers are connerated as follows:

"1st. Control of ritual.

"2d. Qualifications of membership, "3d. The landmarks of the Order."

"Section 6, Article III, of the Constitution defines the first. The 'General Regulations,' page 1 of ritual, defines 'Membership,' and the landmarks of the Order are found on pages 2 and 3 of ritual.

"These three powers rest absolutely under the authority of the General Grand Chapter: therefore no Grand Chapter or Grand officer has any

authority to add thereto or take therefrom

"In two matters only is any portion of the ritual left to the discretion

of the Grand Chapters:

"1st. The General Grand Chapter prescribes only the minimum in

matters of 'collars, robes and other regalia.'

"2d. In the introductory march of the officers into the Chapter hall some latitude is given, but this introductory march must not contain any secret work of the Chapter.

"In all things else there should be uniformity, and this can be ob-

tained by following the ritual,

"The following errors have erept into the ritual, which, if they exist

in your Grand Chapter, see that they are eliminated;

"1st. The collection of a pass from the members at the opening of a Chapter. It is a positive violation of the ritual, to use the cabbalistic word or any of the passes of the five degrees, as a pass word to be collected from the members. The ritual does not specify the collection of any word as a pass.

"2d. The use of the square and compass upon the altar. The ritual does not specify that these implements of Masonry are a part of paraphermalia of a Chapter. The law states that 'upon the altar should be an open Holy Bible.' The Order must avoid the assumption of any of the implements of Masonry, for in Masonry the square and compass have a special significance and a symbolic meaning, while in the O. E. S. they

"Number eight of the landmarks of the Order specifies 'that the degrees can not be conferred unless a brother in good standing shall preside. This landmark is frequently violated by the Matron adininistering the obligation to the candidate.

"4th. The qualification for initiation into the Order is a Master Mason in good Masonie standing, his wife, mother, widow, sister, halfsister, daughter, or a legally-adopted daughter. A step-daughter is not eligible.

"5th. In some Grand Chapters the duty of introducing and accommodating visiting members is delegated to the Marshal of a Chapter and to the Grand Marshal. This is a plain violation of the ritual. It is the duty of the Conductress and Associate Conductress to introduce and welcome visitors, and not that of the Marshal.

#### "SUGGESTIONS.

"The ritual is silent on many minor matters, but for uniformity's sake we would advise, that-

"1st The wearing of aprons by the officers be discontinued. While the wearing of aprons may not be strictly a violation of the ritual, as it comes under the head of regalia, yet the apron is the distinctive badge of a Mason. In the O. E. S. it has no significance, but may cause prejudice. Borrowed plumage is to be avoided.

"2d. The use of rods by Conductress and Associate Conductress be

discontinued.

\*\*3d. In purging a Chapter, each officer examines her side, beginning in the 'East,' viz: The Associate Conductress examines the 'North' side, and the Conductress the 'South' side,

"4th. In the opening ceremony, the Matron and Patron should arise when the other others arise. There is no symbolism in the presiding officers remaining seated as in Masonry, but courtesy to the officers should cause the Matron and Patron to rise when the officers are called up.

"5th. The Matron and Associate should not leave their stations to

greet the candidate

#### "NEW YORK AND NEW JERSEY.

"Many questions have, through misunderstanding, arisen in regard to the reception of dimits and the right of visitations of sisters and brothers

hailing from the Grand Chapters of New York and New Jersey.

"The Grand Chapter of New York publishes its own ritual and it does not differ essentially from the ritual of the General Grand Chapter, but it permits any Master Mason who may so desire, to visit any Chapter without previous notice, petition, inquiry, or election, merely upon a pledge of secreey. Such pledge of secreey does not entitle him to any of the rights or privileges of the Order, or make him a member of it; but he may visit any Chapter, witness its ceremonies and is in possession of all the secrets of the Order, yet not a member of it nor contributing to its support. A Master Mason may become a member of the Order by petition and election, passing through the same ceremonics as the

"The Grand Chapter of New Jersey uses the ritual of the General Grand Chapter, but has introduced the New York feature in permitting a Master Mason to visit under a pledge of secrecy. The qualification for membership in the Order, in both of these Grand Chapters, is the same

as required by the General Grand Chapter.

"In view of these conditions in reference to the two classes of Master Masons who are in possession of the secrets of the Order, we, the M. W. Grand officers of the General Grand Chapter, do promulgate the following orders until further notice:

"1st. That all dimits issued under the seal from any Chapter under the Grand Jurisdiction of the Grand Chapters of New York and New Jersey are legal and entitled to all the privileges of such, subject to the laws of the several Grand Chapters.

"2d. In the right of visitation, it is ordered that any sister, hailing from either of these two Grand Chapters, is entitled to visit a Chapter, subject to the laws of the Grand Jurisdiction in which she desires to

visit, upon passing the prescribed examination or avouchment.

"3d. No Master Mason, hailing from the Grand Chanter of New York or the Grand Chapter of New Jersey, shall be permitted to visit any Chapter upon avouchment; but he shall present to the Patron and Matron of the Chapter that he desires to visit, documentary evidence of his membership in the Order, and pass the prescribed examination. The documentary evidence and examination is the only means by which he can prove his right to visit a Chapter; by documentary evidence is meant a dimit under seal, or a certificate under seal, and of recent date, of good standing in the Order and membership in a Chapter.

"4th. That the Grand Chapters under the General Grand Chapter shall promulgate this edict throughout their jurisdictions without delay.

#### "CLASDESTINE MASONS,

"One of the grave dangers menacing our Order is the growth of clandestine Masonry in the Middle and Eastern States.

"The Order of the Eastern Star must be ever loval to the Grand Lodge Jurisdiction in which it lives. It, therefore, becomes absolutely necessary that the Masonic standing of all petitioners be carefully ex-

"The brother on the Committee of Investigation should be well posted on clandestine Masonry in his city and State. It devolves on him to see that only those whose Masonic qualification rests in legitimate Masonry be admitted

#### "TURISPRUDENCE.

"In order that there may not be so much diversity in matters of law and jurisprudence, we carnestly advise that the laws and jurisprudence of a Grand Chapter should be based, as far as possible, upon the laws and jurisprudence of the Masonie fraternity in which the Grand Chapter exists. The brethren are conversant with these; and a long established system of jurisprudence will thereby become a part of the Order, not subject to the whims and vagary of every modern society,

"In calling your attention to these matters we are actuated solely for the good and permanency of our Order. The General Grand Chapter should be the tie that binds the Grand Chapters into a whole, with

unity in essentials, liberty in non-essentials,

"We should recommend that this letter, or as much of it as may be necessary, be printed and mailed to every Chapter under your jurisdiction

After carefully reading the same I found that it conflicted with some of the decisions of former Past Grand Matrons, which had become a law in Texas, such as the decision of Past Grand Matron Alvord, page 58 of our Constitution, viz: "Any one of the degree passes may be used in opening a Chapter." Also decision of Past Grand Matron Young, page 57 of our Constitution, viz: "That the square and compass should be placed on the Bible, as it is the badge of the Worthy Patron."

I deemed this circular of such vital importance that I answered the Most Worthy Grand Matron, that it would be taken under due consideration. I did not wish to assume the responsibility of issuing this said circular to the Chapters as per the M. W. Grand officers' request before action had been taken by the Grand Chapter. Sometime thereafter, on my official visits, I noticed that the publishing of this circular in the Texas Freemason had created a great deal of confusion in some of the Chapters. I therefore consulted the Grand Patron on this subject, and we decided that for the good of the Order it would be best to publish the following:

"To the Chapters and Members of the Order of the Eastern Star in Texas:

"By reason of circular letter No. 1, sent out from the office of the Most Worthy Grand Matron, and a communication from M. W. Grand Patron, Brother Kuhn, in a recent issue of the Texas Freemason, there has arisen quite a great deal of confusion in different parts of the State, relative to the construction to be given by local Chapters to these communications in as far as they may affect the rules of government and usages and practices of the Order in this State. Because of this confusion and uncertainty among many Chapters, it is thought advisable to say to all members of the Order in Texas, and to all local Chapters in this Grand Jurisdiction, that the Grand Chapter of Texas is supreme in all its affairs, and the government of the Order in this State is solely dependent upon it, and none other. The Constitution and By-laws, rules and regulations of this Grand Chapter, constitute the laws by which we are governed, and no Chapter nor individual member has any right nor power to make any change in our established practices as laid down in our laws and regulations and as promulgated by our Grand officers until such change or variance is authorized by the Grand Chapter through its proper officers.

#### OFFICIAL VISITS.

November 23, 1904, I organized Crafton Chapter as Crafton, with 20 chartered members. While in Crafton I had the pleasure of meeting Brother Norwood, the prime mover in the organization. So well up in the work is he that I had no hesitancy in leaving the young Chapter under his care. My thanks are due the members, but more especially this brother, who not only showed me all courtesy, but met me at the train, and drove me to and fro, a distance of twelve miles, in his own buggy. This Chapter was organized with very little expense to the Grand Chapter.

November 24, 1904, found me on my way to Ouanah, where I had been requested to come to investigate some dissensions, which had been brewing among the members for over a year. On the night of the 25th I called the Chapter to order, and after a very heated meeting I was pleased to leave this Chapter in a harmonious condition, both sides shaking hands, and a veritable love-feast was held. While in Quanah, the members showed me every courtesy, paid hotel bill and railroad fare.

December 16, 1901, Lorganized Denton Chapter at Denton, with all of the twenty charter members present, and at 8:00 o'clock initiated eight new members. I am happy to say that this Chapter is composed of bright and energetic sisters and brothers, and I had very little trouble in teaching them the work of our beautiful Order. Credit is due the Worthy Matron, Sister Minnis, Worthy Patron Brother Stovall, and Brother Zumwalt, for the interest they took in having this Chapter organized. Denton Chapter starts with a good membership, and promises to be a substantial link sin our golden chain.

March 14, 1905, I arrived at Valley Mills at 11:20 A. M. At 2:00 P. M, repaired to the hall, where I found a goodly number of sisters, and at their request, held a school of instruction. I found them pretty well up in the ritualistic work, especially as they had had no instruction since their organization, and never had received a visit from a Grand officer. Their cornestness and willingness to learn made them apt scholars, and all my instructions were readily received. At 8:00 o'clock repaired to the hall, and the Chapter was opened with all officers present. The marching in of these sisters would have done credit to a much older Chapter. I found their books kept in a business-like manner, and I was pleased to see the work so nicely rendered.

March 15, 1905, I left for Crawford, where I expected to organize at 3:00 o'clock, according to appointment, but owing to very bad weather, and not being able to get the members out, organized Thursday morning. working until 1:00 P. M.; again in the afternoon, resuming work at night. then the next morning with the Worthy Matron and Conductress, leaving them well up in the secret and ritualistic work. I could not give them as much instruction as I would have liked, for, my dates being arranged. I was compelled to leave, hoping at some future time to be able to give

them further instruction.

March 17, 1905. I reached the thriving city of Gatesville, and at 7:30 P. M. repaired to the Masonic Hall. The Chapter was opened in due form by the Worthy Matron. After examining the books, which I found neatly kept, the initiatory work was given, and all corrections gladly received. Next morning I held a school of instruction with the officers, which was highly appreciated. While in Gatesville, I was the guest of Bonner Raby Chapter, they paying my expense at the hotel.

March 18, 1905, on the evening of the 18th it was my pleasure, in company with the Grand Patron, this being his home Chapter, to meet with W. E. Owens Chapter, where I was given a hearty welcome. Their Worthy Matron, Sister Rosa Mattison, and Worthy Patron, Brother W. R. Jurney, are carnest workers, and are ably assisted by a good corps of officers. My thanks are due this Chapter for holding this meeting

just two days prior to their regular meeting.

March 20, 1905, I held a meeting with Marlin Chapter. This Chapter had, on account of the removal of several of their others, done nothing for some time. I was much grieved to see this state of affairs; however, the little handful pledged themselves to attend more regularly. and to do all in their power to get the other members interested, and I trust that they will yet wake up to the noble interests of our Order.

March 21, 1905, I was to visit Mart, and have Elk Chapter to meet with them on this date, but I was notified by the Worthy Matron, Sister Swain, that it would be impossible to receive me at that time; the Grand Patron, being so near at hand, could examine their books later on.

March 22, 1905, I started for the little city of West, arriving there just in time to be escorted to the hall, where quite a crowd were in waiting. The Chapter was very efficiently opened by the Worthy Matron, Sister Glean, who is to be complimented for the able manner in which she and her officers rendered the work. They are an earnest band of workers, and therefore a thriving little Chapter.

March 23, 1905, I officially visited Abbott Chapter. At 2:00 P. M. was escorted to the hall, where Rienzi Chapter had been invited to exemplify the work. but, owing to the very had roads, it was impossible for them to come. I held a school of instruction, and all corrections were courteously received. At night the whole membership was on hand to witness the exemplification of the work, which was given in a creditable manner. The Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron deserve much praise for their untiring efforts in behalf of the Chapter.

March 24, 1905, I went to Hillsboro, where a cordial reception was given me. I was very much pleased to note the renewed enthusiasm of the members of this Chapter. Their books are well kept, and all officers well up in their parts—all imbued with the teachings of our Order.

March 25, 1905, in company with Sister Satterfield, Worthy Matron of Annie M. Chapter, I bounded the train for Itasca. Files Chapter had been invited to exemplify the work, but, failing to do so, I held a school of instruction. At night the Worthy Matron opened up the Chapter, and I was agreeably surprised to see all officers giving the work without the rituals, although quite a number were substitutes. I could not refrain from complimenting this Chapter, and giving them the praise that was due them.

April 4, 1905, by special invitation, visited Denton Chapter, to witness the initiation of a class of candidates. The marching in and opening ceremonics was quite a feature, and at my request every ritual was placed on the Secretary's desk, and the initiation given without the use of the ritual. The work, with the addition of music, was beautifully rendered. I could but feel proud of this Chapter, not quite four months old, yet doing the work in a manner that would put to shame Chapters several years older.

April 5, 1905, I arrived at Pilot Point where, I regret to say, I found the Chapter not doing anything, mostly on account of the lack of interest of the presiding officer. I notified the Worthy Matron of my coming and convening the Chapter for that date, and received acknowledgment of the same, but, to my surprise, that evening both Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron shone by their absence, without any plausible excuse. I desire to thank the Secretary, Sister Bauer, and Past Matron, Sister Carson for their kindness. Had it not been for them, no meeting would have been held, and if the Chapter still holds together, it is due to their efforts.

April 6, 1905, assisted by our Grand Marshal, Sister Brown, organized Golden Chapter at Collinsville with twenty chartered members. After five sessions, I had the pleasure of seeing every officer go through the secret work in a manner which left no doubt in my mind of the success of Chapter. At the end of my labors with them Dr. Hughes, in behalf of the this Chapter, presented me with a lovely watch chain. This was indeed a surprise, and the kind words accompanying this gift will long remain fresh in my mind. I was also the recipient of a beautiful pearlhandle pocket-knife, the gift of Sister and Brother Bowles.

April 17, 1905, I visited Dorcas Chapter at Elgin. Mter the opening of the Chapter I examined the minutes and record books, and found everything in a good condition. Four candidates were initiated into the Order I was the recipient of a lovely boquet of in a creditable manner.

April 18, 1905, I arrived at Bastrop, where I paid an official visit to Mina Chapter. This Chapter is to be congratulated for having such a lovely hall. After the opening of the Chapter I examined the books, and I am pleased to say they have a Secretary who ably understands her work. The initiation was given in a very concise manner, denoting care, a love of the work, and all seemed very much encouraged by my visit.

April 19, 1905, found me in the lovely city of Smithville. Along my route I had heard of the nice work done by this Chapter, and was more than surprised to find them almost letter perfect, every officer giving the opening initiatory and closing without the use of a ritual. In my honor the "Mystic Tie" was given very beautifully, and the initiatory work was enhanced by lovely stereopticon views and singing. This is one of the most flourishing Chapters in the State, which is largely due to the Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron and all officers not being afraid to exert a little energy, and work to accomplish this end. Would that more Chapters had this energy and love of the Order! A lovely arm cluster of roses was presented to me.

April 20, 1905, at 5:05 A. M., I was speeding my way towards Lockhart, arriving there in time to eaten the only train going to Red Rock to meet with that Chapter. I found this Chapter almost dead, only eleven members present. Having only a few officers, the work was not given. I examined their books, which showed that they were in good hands. So many of the officers having moved away and this being a small place, the faithful few had lost all courage. Since my visit to them, I heard that they are once more striving to get on their feet. Much credit is due the Associate Matron, Sister Hill, and Sister Runk.

April 21, 1905, at 6:00 P. M., in company with six members of Red Rock Chapter, I boarded a caboose (as there had been a wreck and no trains could pass through) for Lockhart, where I was due at 8:00 o'clock. Quite a large gathering met me at the Masonic hall. This Chapter deserves credit for their untiring efforts to keep up, having received but very little instruction. Nevertheless, they did remarkably well, and all enlightenment and correction was eagerly sought for.

April 22, 1905, I was driven at 4000 A. M. to the depot, where I was soon speeding my way to the lovely city of San Marcos, where Lorganized a bright Chapter that evening, with seventeen chartered members, remaining with them until Sunday morning. While in San Marcos, was the guest of the Chapter, they paying my expenses at the hotel. They start out under favorable conditions, and we expect to soon see a large and prosperous Chapter.

April 24, 1905, I paid a visit to Kerrville Chapter, where, I am sorry to say, I found very little interest and only a few faithful ones to hold together. I found all present well up in the work, with books nicely kept. But these true and tried ones are very much discouraged, and I fear the day is not far distant when they will surrender their Charter. The Worthy Matron and Patron deserve great credit for their efforts to keep this Chapter alive.

April 25, 1905, I left Kerrville for the historic city of San Antonio, where I had the pleasure of meeting Past Grand Patron McDaniel and his lovely wife. Attended the meeting of San Antonio Chapter, where I was pleased to meet our Associate Grand Matron, Sister Randolph. The work was then given, after which Sister Vogt, in behalf of the Chapter, presented me with a lovely souvenir spoon. Sister Robinson, Worthy Matron of Adah Chapter, also presented me with a handsome souvenir fork, gift of her Chapter. At the same meeting a lovely spoon was presented to Sister Randolph, Associate Grand Matron.

April 26, 1905, I met with Devine Chapter at 3:00 o'clock. On account of the carnival at San Antonio, quite a few were absent; however, a good crowd were out. I found the officers well up in the work, showing good, earnest labor, and much encouraged by my visit. Arriving in San Antonio that night again, I was escorted to the palatial home of Brother and Sister McDaniel, where I enjoyed a pleasant visit from

Sisters Randolph, Baugh and Sister Robinson,

April 27, 1905, I visited Del Rio Chapter. Here, indeed was a band of good, carnest workers, who, having never received a visit from a Grand Matron, were anxious for all information and correction. The Worthy Matron, Sister Sneddon, deserves compliments for the able manner in which she has carried on this Chapter, never letting the interest lag. The books were in good condition, and every member wide awake to the best interest of our Order. So great was their desire for me to visit them, that not only was I entertained by them, but my railroad fare was also paid from San Antonio to their city.

April 28, 1905, I had the pleasure of meeting with Esther Chapter at Eagle Pass. I held a school of instruction in the afternoon. At night a hail storm and a torrential rain being the order of the day, only a few members were present. All showed the interest they took. I had the satisfaction of leaving them well up in the secret work. I was presented with a lovely spoon by the Worthy Matron, Sister Simpson, as a souvenir of my visit to the border. This Chapter delightfully entertained me, and

also paid my return trip to San Antonio.

April 29, 1905, I boarded the train for San Antonio, where the smiling faces of Sisters Baugh and Johnson met me at the train. A terrific cyclone having passed through Laredo, Sister Randolph remained at the home of Sister Baugh trying to get news from home, where luckily none of her family were hurt. On my arrival I attended a meeting of Adah Chapter. I am pleased to mention that their books were nicely kept. The exemplification of their work was then given, with Past Grand Patron Karney presiding as Worthy Patron. A good number of San Antonio Chapter were in attendance, and all enjoyed the meeting.

May 1, 1905, I left San Antonio for Floresville, where I organized Jasmine Chapter, with twenty chartered members. After spending two days with them, had the satisfaction of leaving all officers well up in the secret and ritualistic work. This Chapter bids fair to be one of the

best Chapters in the State.

May 3, 1905, I arrived at Kennedy, where I found a good many members of Runge Chapter, who had been invited. I held a school of instruction for both Chapters, which was earnestly desired, all profiting by the lessons, an example of which was seen that night at the rendition of the work given in a creditable manner. I left Kennedy at midnight on my way to Galveston.

May 4, 1905, by request, I attended the regular meeting of Mizpah Chapter No. 2 of Galveston. This is the home Chapter of our Past

Grand Matron, Sister Walker.

May 5, 1905, Ransford Chapter not being able to get the hall, I was forced to cancel my date with this Chapter, but had a pleasant social time with them later on.

May 6, 1905, I visited Alvin Chapter. While this Chapter is not very large, the members make up in quality what they lack in quantity. All officers are well up in their work, books in good shape, and everything in a healthy and harmonious condition.

May 8, 1905, I arrived at Angleton, and repaired to Masonic hall, where a nice crowd had assembled. The work was very nicely given, showing good, earnest labor. Before the closing of the Chapter flowers were given me in a novel way, the two Conductresses forming an arch, each officer with an appropriate speech presenting their offering, and at the end I had a lovely bouquet made up of the five colors of the Order.

May 9, 1905, learning that the town of Velasco was under water, and not being able to communicate with them, either by wire or telephone. I found it would be impossible to go there. I regretted very much to be unable to pay this Chapter a visit, having learned that they were in need of instruction, as a great many of the officers and members had moved away, and the interest was somewhat at a standstill.

A few faithful ones, however, were holding it together.

May 10, 1905, I was tendered a social evening by the members of Ransford Chapter of Houston. I had the pleasure of meeting our Deputy Grand Matrons Lane and Wood. After a nice programme, refreshments were served. Sister Brown, in behalf of the Chapter, presented me with a beautiful box of flowers.

May 11, 1905, found me on my way to Victoria, where I paid a visit to Violet Chapter that night. I was very well pleased with the way the work was rendered. The Conductress certainly understands her work. Books are well kept, and peace and harmony prevail. I was here presented by Brother Hill with a lovely souvenir spoon in behalf of Violet Chapter.

May 12, 1905, I boarded the train for Rockdale, my next destination, Yoakum having notified me that on account of so many of the officers and members being absent they could not hold a meeting. At Rockdale I was well pleased to see such a good crowd out. The work of opening, initiatory and closing was given in a very nice manner. Their books, being in the hands of an up-to-date secretary, were kept in a thorough basiness style. I took my train at 3:00 o'clock A. M., arriving in Dallas May 13th.

June 2, 1905, I organized Regina Chapter at Clifton. Here I had the pleasure of leaving all officers not only well up on the secret work, but several of them had committed their ritualistic part as well, showing that the interest taken was sincere, and I predict for this Chapter a bright and prosperous future.

June 5, 1905, I paid an official visit to Farmersville Chapter. Methough having called the meeting for 2:00 o'clock, quite a good number were out, and while a few of the stations were filled pro tem, all showed the love of the Order and a great deal of painstaking. Sister King, their Worthy Matron, has worked hard to get them to this standard. This

Chapter paid my railroad fare from Dallas.

That evening at 8:00 o'clock I met with Celeste Chapter. As I had been unable to visit Kingston Chapter, at my request they were invited to meet with Celeste Chapter. The Worthy Matron and several officers of Kingston Chapter were present, and quite a nice meeting held, all profiting by the instructions and anxious to learn. Celeste Chapter is doing some good work, and their Worthy Matron deserves credit tor the work she does for this Chapter.

June 6, 1905, I met with Wolfe City Chapter at 2:00 P. M., where I was sorry to find very little interest, although a handful were struggling hard to keep it alive. To these faithful few I wish to extend my appreciation and thanks. Their books were neatly kept, and Sister Royal deserves credit for her untiring efforts. While there, thinking it for the good of the Chapter, I granted them a dispensation, without fee, to

change their time of meeting,

The same day I stopped in Ladonia, to pay an official visit to Ladonia Chapter. A large crowd was in attendance. I found this Chapter, under the leadership of Sister Barlow, doing some very good work. All the members are interested and enthusiastic, having one mind and purpose, for the good of our beloved Order. Here I had the pleasure of meeting Brother Dennis, Deputy Grand Patron.

June 7, 1905. I visited Detroit Chapter; was indeed proud to see this little Chapter pretty well up in the secret work and eager to learn all they could. Their officers are good and conscientious, their Secretary keeping all records in a neat and business-like manner. Harmony and

peace prevail.

On that day I arrived at Paris. That night, on account of the members not being able to get the hall, an informal reception was held at the home of Sister Benson, Associate Matron, where I believe the entire membership met me. After seeing that all was secure, and at the earnest request of members, we held a school of instruction, where all questions were asked, and each and every one declared the evening a prohtable as well as an enjoyable one.

June 8, 1905, in the afternoon, I met with Cooper Chapter. I am sorry to say that, on account of a protracted meeting, and it also being "preserving time." only a few faithful members turned out. After examining their books, which I found in good shape, I held a school of

instruction.

Then I went to Commerce, but regret to say that, on account of absence of officers from the city at that time, could hold no meeting. Their books are well kept, and show a very good membership. The secretary of the Fairlee Chapter being present with his books, I also examined them, and found his records and minute books in good order.

June 9, 1905, I arrived at Greenville and paid a visit to Greenville Chapter that night, where I was pleased to meet Past Grand Matron Minnie E. Smith. This is the home Chapter of the Grand Treasurer. Sister Seaman. I found all officers well up in their work, and books and records in fine shape, the Worthy Matron and Patron both deserving

great credit for having such a good, live Chapter.

June 10, 1905, I left Greenville, accompanied by Sisters Smith and Seaman, and paid an official visit to Caddo Mills Chapter, a very lively little Chapter, well up in the work, and books in good condition. I was indeed well pleased with the work of this Chapter and its members. Here I found a great deal of energy and interest. Where these two

qualities are lacking, no Chapter can live.

June 12, 1905, I arrived in Gainesville. The Masons holding their annual election, Belle Moon Chapter was not able to procure the hall. A social meeting and reception was tendered me at the home of the Worthy Matron, Sister Bailey. After an enjoyable time, I held a little school of instruction, which was highly appreciated by all members.—1 had the pleasure of meeting Past Grand Patron Atchison and his wife.

While in Gainesville I was the guest of Belle Moon Chapter, they de-

fraying hotel expenses.

June 13, 1905, I boarded the train for Myra, where quite a band of earnest members met me, and after dinner we repaired to the Masonic hall, where, after the opening of the Chapter, I examined the books which are in fine shape, and held a school of instruction. All corrections were very much appreciated. Although the members had never received a visit from a Grand officer, nevertheless they were doing some nice work. Leaving Myra I reached the thriving little city of Saint Jo. At night I met with Saint Jo Chapter. I was surprised to find quite a live little Chapter, with such a nice attendance, and all carnest members. After the opening of the Chapter and rendition of the work. I gave them instructions in the secret work, which was enthusiastically received. This Chapter deserves a great deal of credit, for outside of the organization they had never received any instructions, nor a visit from any Grand officer. And with the zeal they manifested, I predict a bright future for Saint Jo Chapter.

Jane 14, 1905, I went to Nocona, where I had the pleasure of meeting with Nocona Chapter. I found this Chapter doing well, notwithstanding that they had been sorely neglected, never having received an official visit from a Grand Matron or Deputy since the organization. Under the able direction of the Worthy Patron, this little Chapter has kept alive, and all officers are thoroughly up on the secret work. I owe this Chapter a debt of gratitude for the many kindnesses shown me. The Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron and several others drove me over to Spanish

Fort, a distance of twenty miles, in their private conveyances.

June 15, 1905, I organized Spanish Fort Chapter, ably assisted by the officers of Nocona Chapter. While this is a small place, the members are very much in carnest and in love with the work and eager to learn, and I am pleased to note that the Worthy Patron and all officers were well up on the work before my departure. Thanks are due this Chapter for their many kindnesses, and all things seem favorable for a good Chapter.

June 17, 1905, I met with Ringgold Chapter. This Chapter was only a few months old, and I was most agreeably surprised at their manner of exemplifying the work." They promise to be one of the best in the State. They have a good Sceretary, and all are eager to learn.

June 19, 1905, I organized Seago Chapter at Seagoville. All of the chartered members present. They have material for a good, live Chapter, and its members were very enthusiastic, and I left them well up in the work. Hope to hear a good report from this Chapter in the future.

July 4, 1905, I was called to Cason, there to organize a Chapter. Here I was pleased to note the earnest labor of these good sisters and brothers, who so eagerly grasped all of the secret work. They are to be congratulated for having such an excellent Worthy Matron and Patron. The Chapter must prosper under their guidance

July 5, 1905, I organized a Chapter at Pittsburg with all chartered members present. The members readily fell into the line of work, and after several sessions I had the pleasure of seeing them go through the work like old veterans. There I had the pleasure of meeting and being ably assisted by Sister Northern, a member of long standing in the Order of the Eastern Star, and who will be of great help to this Chapter.

July 7, 1905, I organized Naomi Chapter at Grand Saline, with the twenty charter members. A more earnest band of workers I have hardly ever found. This Chapter is in good hands, and with Sister Lineberg as their Worthy Matron I predict that this Chapter will soon forge itself to the front as one of the foremost Chapters in the State. I have learned that since their organization their membership had increased wonderfully and they are able to give points in the work to many old chartered Chapters.

July 10, 1905, I paid an official visit to Godley Chapter. I found this Chapter laboring under difficulties, and very little interest taken by the members, outside of a handful of faithful workers. This Chapter has not the support it should have from the Masonic brethren; but, to my amazement, this little band is thoroughly up on the secret work, and the Secretary deserves much credit as her books are kept in a neat and good condition. I had the pleasure of being assisted by Past Patron Greenwold, and the Associate Matron, Sister Greenwold, of Dallas Chapter

On that day, at night, I attended a meeting of Ruth Chapter at Cleburne, the home Chapter of our Associate Grand Conductress, Sister Johnson. I was gratified to find this Chapter shining so brightly, showing much care and attention bestowed upon the Chapter by each officer. After the closing of the Chapter a musical program was given. Brother Ramsey, in the name of the Chapter, presented me with a handsome hand-painted loving cup, as a gift of the fraternal love of this Chapter for their Grand Matron. I had the pleasure of meeting our Grand Chaplain, Sister Farmer, who now resides in that city. I was also the recipient of a lovely basket of fruit for my journey, from Sister and Brother Far-

July 11, 1905, I had the pleasure of meeting with Vashti Chapter in Temple. There I found a Chapter which worked in such harmony and unity that it was more like a home circle than a Chapter. All of the officers and members are interested and enthusiastic. This Chapter can justly feel proud of their officers, as they rendered their work very effi-ciently. The Secretary's books were fine. The Worthy Matron deserves credit and praise for her able management. I had the pleasure of meeting Past Grand Marshal Sister Wendland.

At night, that day, in company of quite a number of sisters and brothers from Vashti Chapter, on short notice, I visited Corinthian Chapter at Belton. This Chapter was hardly a month old. A good many of the officers were absent; nevertheless we held quite a nice little meeting of instruction. Sister Harkey, Deputy Grand Matron, is an earnest worker in that field, and under her guidance this little Chapter will do good work.

July 12, 1905. I arrived at Somerville, where, I am sorry to report, outside of eight or nine members, there is very little interest taken. The Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron deserve credit for the good, earnest labor they take in the work, and if all were as enthusiastic as they, Somerville Chapter would flourish like a bay-tree. I had the pleasure there of meeting Deputy Grand Patron Tucker and his wife, of Plantersville. This Chapter paid my hotel expenses.

On the 12th, I also inspected Oak Grove Chapter at Plantersville. This is not a very large Chapter; however quite a number were out that night. The work, under the leadership of Sister Grant and Brother Tucker, was efficiently rendered, their Conductress giving the work in a manner such as to leave no doubt in one's mind that the candidate must be well impressed. Books were also in good condition.

July 13, 1905, I paid my official visit to Esther Chapter at Montgomery. I found the books and records of the Secretary well kept. This Chapter is composed of enthusiastic sisters and brothers, and with their Worthy Matron, Sister Campbell, as their efficient leader, I predict great things for this thriving little Chapter. All officers were eager to learn, and seemed very much helped by my visit.

At night on that day I met with Conroe Chapter. Here the entire membership was in the hall when I arrived; also a number from Willis We had a very nice meeting, Brother Daniels of Willis Chapter presiding. All information and instructions were eagerly sought. more zealous band of workers I have seldom met. Books and records in good shape. Since many from Willis Chapter were present, the work

was given so that all could profit by it. I examined the books of this little Chapter, and am pleased to note that the records show a good, lively interest in the work. These two Chapters are yet in their infancy, and I predict for both a bright future. Here again I was the guest of

Conroe Chapter, they paying all hotel expenses.

July 14, 1905, I arrived in Cleveland to find no one to meet me. I repaired to a hotel, where I remained all day without seeing any of the members, but had been told there was to be a meeting that night. I had convened Lamb Chapter to meet here, and was indeed surprised to see such a lack of interest. However, at night a couple of sisters came after me, and we repaired to the Masonic hall, where, with Tarkington Prairie and Lamb combined, barely a quorum were out. Tarkington Prairie has done nothing, and the members are very much discouraged.

I was greatly disappointed with my visit at this place.

July 15, 1905, I paid a visit to Orange Chapter. The Chapter was called to order promptly at 2:00 o'clock. Their marches were very pretty: the Worthy Matron presided with dignity, and the working of the Chapter shows a wise guiding hand. Their work as a whole was far above the average, each officer doing her work in a very creditable manner. Their Conductress is simply fine. Books and records show a busy year and well kept. This Chapter is indeed a credit to the Order. I was the recipient of a lovely bouquet of flowers, the gift of the Chapter,

and was the guest of the Chapter during my stay.

Leaving in company with fourteen sisters of Orange Chapter, we met with Beaumont Chapter at night, the home Chapter of our Associate Grand Patron, Brother Orchard. Quite a number of members, including the Worthy Matron, were absent. Sister Glassocks, taking the chair, presided in a dignified manner. This Chapter has a large membership, and great credit is due Brother Orchard for his untiring efforts in behalf

of the Chapter. July 17, 1905, I arrived at Rogan, where I took the mail hack for my next destination. After a three hours' drive through the piney woods, and during a severe thunderstorm and heavy rain, I arrived in the little inland city of Newton, where I paid an official visit that night to Newton Chapter. This being a small Chapter, I was agreeably sur-prised to find so many members present. The work was very well given. And here I wish to say that during my trips I have rarely met a Worthy Patron giving the obligation and secret work as well as Brother West did on this occasion. The books are nicely kept.

July 18, 1905, arriving at San Augustine during a terrific rain, it was impossible to hold a meeting with Gillespie (U. D.) Chapter that night. Next morning (19th) I held a meeting with this young Chapter, and was pleased to see them so well up in the work. Their Worthy Matron thoroughly understands her arduous position, and under her guidance

this little Chapter will make a name for itself.

July 19, 1905, in company with Sisters Rogers and Brock of Beaumont, I visited Port Arthur Chapter. This Chapter, only six months old, is striving hard to become a good and prosperous Chapter. The work rendered by the officers is deserving of praise. In the absence of Sister Harris, Worthy Matron, the Associate Matron, Sister Garrard, tilled the chair in an efficient manner.

July 20, 1905, I paid an official visit to Dayton Chapter, and found this little Chapter, under the guiding hand of Sister Babcock, doing good work. They have just moved into their new hall, which is indeed very

pretty. I found their books and records in fine condition.

Inly 21, 1905, I visited Crosby Chapter. This Chapter is only eight months old, and out of a membership of twenty-eight, twenty-three were present. I held a school of instruction, and found this Chapter very energetic and willing to learn all they could to further the good of the Order. I found a nice set of books, well kept.

July 22, 1905, I organized San Felipe Chapter at Sealy, and after three sessions, had the pleasure of seeing them well up on the work. This Chapter has the material to make a good Chapter, and all were delighted with the work of our loved Order.

July 24, 1905. I held a school of instruction with Runge Chapter in the morning. This Chapter had received very little instruction, and I am sorry to say they felt very much neglected by the Grand Chapter. They are to be congratulated for having held together so long, as they were much discouraged. The Chapter was called to order at 130 P. M. I was pleased to note the presence of fourteen sisters from Kennedy Chapter. The work was well given. Their books are neatly kept. Since my visit to them I have heard they are doing nicely, and I trust they will always continue to do so. Here again I was the guest of the Chapter, they defraying hotel expenses.

The same day, accompanied by fifteen sisters and brothers of Runge Chapter, I organized Helena Chapter at Helena. Sister Bennet of Runge Chapter acted as Grand Marshal. I remained with this new Chapter, giving them instructions, until Tuesday evening, leaving them well up in the secret as well as ritualistic work. Their Worthy Matron and Patron being so enthusiastic, I have since learned that practice meetings

are held weekly

August 1, 1905, I inspected Prairie Gew Chapter at Chillicothe, at 8300 o'clock at night. This little Chapter is rapidly forging to the front. I was well impressed with the carnestness of the officers. Corrections were cheerfully accepted. Books showed nice attendance and their minutes well kept. They have in Sister Gibbs, their Worthy Matron.

a faithful worker.

August 2, 1908, I boarded the train at 3:15 A. M. on my way to the city of Quanali. At 3:00 o'clock P. M. promptly, the Chapter was opened in due form. Here I had the pleasure of meeting quite a good crowd of caracst workers, the work of all officers showing painstaking. Their Worthy Matron, Sister Wilson, and Sister Leibetter as Conductress, are deserving special praise. At 5:10 P. M., accompanied by a large crowd of sisters and brothers, I was conducted to the depot, where with Sister Williams and Sister Smith I took the train for Childress At 8:50 P. M., at Childress, I repaired to the Masonic hall, to find a large gathering of members of Childress Chapter to meet me. This is the home Chapter of Sister Dwight, Crand Warder. The work was given in a creditable manner, books showing a prosperous year, and peace and harmony prevailing throughout. I had the pleasure of meeting Sister Housels, Deputy Crand Matron.

August 3, 1905, at 4:15 Å. M., escorted by Sister and Brother Cope, found me headed for the depot, where I boarded the train for Estelline. In this little city I found that a big barbecue was to take place. After taking in the barbecue, in company with the members we repaired to the Masonic hall, where I was pleased to note the good work of the officers. All are interested and take a pride in the Order. Their books are neatly kept. On arriving at the depot at 11 o'clock, I found to my dismay that the train was nine hours late, and much to my regret.

I was compelled to cancel date with Clarendon Chapter.

August 4, 1905, I visited Red Rose Chapter at Claude. I found this little band of officers quite earnest in their labor, due to the efficiency of the Worthy Matron, Sister Rickey. Here I had the pleasure of meeting Sister Cray, Grand Conductress, and Sister Morgan, Deputy Grand Matron. I found a nice set of books, well kept, and everything in good condition. My train again being late, after a wait of three hours, accompanied by Sister Morgan as far as Amarillo, I was soon speeding on my way to Dalhart.

August 5, 1905 on account of a very bad wreck, I found it utterly impossible to get to Stratford, cancelling my date with this Chapter by

telegram. The evening was spent with Dalhart Chapter. I found all officers well up in the work. In the absence of Sister Inman, Worthy Matron, the Associate Matron filled her chair very efficiently. Everything is moving along smoothly and their books are in good order.

August 7, 1905, at 10:00 A. M., I was escorted to the Masonic hall to pay an official visit to Bonita Chapter of Amarillo, and a large crowd greeted me. The Chapter was opened by Sister Morgan, who presides with true grace and dignity, and is ably supported by a good board of officers. The exemplification of the work was given in a proficient manner. At my request the floral work was given, which added much to the day's entertainment. A lovely souvenir spoon was presented me

by Sister Morgan, on behalf of Bonita Chapter.

August 8, 1905, I arrived in Miami at 7:00 A. M. The members of this Chapter are deserving of great praise. Their hall and all belongings having been destroyed by fire; nothing daunted, they still hold their meetings. On account of the smallness of their meeting room, no work could be done, but I was pleased to see all officers very bright in the work and very progressive. My special thanks are due this Chapter, and Sister Gist more especially, for having met in the morning at such short notice, instead of afternoon, as first intended. This Chapter is fortunate in having for one of its members such a hard, carnest worker as Sister Gist. It is not surprising that with her help, and the able Worthy Matron that they have, that this Chapter still holds its own, although so severely tried. Their books are well kept.

That afternoon found me riding in a caboose towards the little city of Canadian. At night I inspected this Chapter, and although so far away, almost the extreme part of the State, I found them well up in the work, books in an excellent condition, and all inbued with the

teachings of our noble Order.

August 9, 1905, I spent the evening with the Clarendon Chapter, the home Chapter of Sister Gray, Grand Conductress, where I found the Chapter in good hands, their Worthy Matron, Sister Williams, being well up in the work, and ably assisted by her corps of officers. I was presented by Sister Williams, on behalf of the Chapter, with a lovely cut glass vase.

August 10, 1905, inspected Canyon City Chapter at Canyon City. 1 was pleased to see all officers out and well up in their secret work. While this is a small Chapter, still they are doing some excellent work. Their books are in thoroughly competent hands. This Chapter defrayed stage

fare for me to Tulia.

August 11, 1905. I boarded the United States mail coach at 7:00 o'clock bound for the little city of Tulia, where I arrived after a very warm and tiresome eight hours' ride over rough roads. Met with Mary Chapter at 4:30 P. M. I found this Chapter in a good, healthy condition—their books kept in a neat, precise way. They are to be congratulated on having such a good Secretary. Their Worthy Matron, Sister Scott, and their Worthy Patron, Brother Haile, are very enthusiastic, and with them at the head this Chapter is doing nicely. My thanks are due this Chapter for having me driven in private conveyance to Plainview.

August 12, 1905, just as I was starting for Silverton, a note was handed me from the Worthy Matron of that Chapter to not come to Silverton, for she could not get a quorum out. This is one of the most disinterested Chapters that I have met, the members not taking enough interest to attend a meeting, when the Grand Matron was willing to take a twenty-live mile drive over there to give them assistance and instruction. I do not see what they ever expect to accomplish, as I have been told that since their organization they have treated in like manner, all Grand officers or deputies who have attempted to pay them a visit. If such is the case, they are far from being a credit to the Order.

Grand Chapter of Texas.

August 14, 1905, through the kindness and courtesy of Plainyjew Chapter, I held a meeting with them on the morning of the 14th, instead of that night. A more carnest little band of workers in the field of the Order of the Eastern Star I have never come across. All officers well up in the secret work, books nicely kept, and all seemed pleased and encouraged by my visit. Accompanied by Sisters Knight, Dve and Burch, these ladies furnishing their own conveyances, I was driven to Hale Center, a distance of eighteen miles.

After my arrival, I paid an official visit to Lemond Chapter at Hale Center, the home Chapter of Past Crand Patron Lemond, and Sister Alley, Crand Adah. On account of hastening my visit twenty-four hours sooner, as large a crowd was not out as otherwise would have been. I found their books neatly kept. Having to substitute quite a number of officers, the exemplification of the work was not given, but knowing this Chapter to be in good and competent hands, I feel assured they do some good work. Lemond Chapter defrayed stage fare to Lubbock.

August 15, 1905, after telephoning to Lubbock to find out if I could meet with them a night sooner, I left Hale Center by stage in the morn-Brother Lemond was to accompany me on my rounds on the plains, but I thought it too much to ask of him, and he being needed just at that time at home, I prevailed upon him to remain with Sister Lemond. and started on my thirty-seven-mile drive for Lubbock, arriving there at 6:00 o'clock P. M. On my arrival, I found that by some misunderstanding, no meeting had been called, and having made other arrangements, much to my regret I could not remain any longer than the next morning. I had the Worthy Matron send for the Secretary's books, and I was appalled to find that no meetings had been recorded since March, although the Worthy Matron assured me that meetings had been held regularly, and that the Secretary read them from slips of paper before copying them in her books. But these slips of paper could not be found. I was forced to give a reprimand, and I am pleased to say that the Worthy Matron promised to look into the matter and see that the books were Lept in better shape

August 16, 1905, I boarded the United States mail coach for Estacado, twenty-seven nules northeast. Here again I must mention the kindness of this Chapter for holding their meeting twenty-four hours ahead of time Although not all of the members were out, yet quite a good number were present. Their books are properly kept, and I am pleased to say they are well up in the secret work, peace and harmony prevailing. My thanks are due this Chapter for having had one of their members take me to Floydada, twenty-seven miles, in their own conveyance.

August 47, 1905. I held an official visit with Floydada Chapter at Floydada This Chapter deserves credit for the good attendance, and the splendid condition of the Chapter. They have a very proficient Secretary, books are neatly kept, and the Worthy Matron and all officers well up in the secret work. I feel that I owe them considerable thanks for meeting twenty-four hours ahead of the time first appointed, and the many courtesies shown me. This Chapter paid my stage fare from Floydada to Childress, as did all but one on the plains.

I have met with Chapters that have not been indifferent, but ignorant as to how the work should be done, and more than willing and ever anxious to be taught. I especially tried to strengthen the weak Chapters as I felt that they were the ones who needed and appreciated a visit from the Crand Matron.

In visiting the Chapters I have held schools of instruction, and at each the members have expressed themselves as having received great benefit. All the loving words, kind acts, and courtesies shown me by all of these Chapters have been fully appreciated.

To those in whose homes I have been so nicely entertained. I return my thanks. Loyely and costly gifts have been given me, and I was made to feel that my visits were indeed a help to them.

#### DECISIONS.

Many questions have come to me. Most of them I have answered by referring to the Constitution. However, I submit a few:

1. Question-Can we initiate a man who is blind in one eye?

Answer-There is nothing in our laws to prevent it, providing he is a Master Mason.

Ques.—If after three weeks certain petitions for the Order of the Eastern Star degrees are reported favorable by committee and ballots on said petition are spread, is the ballot under these conditions legal, without motion to waive time?

Ans.--While it is not in regular form, as one month should have elapsed, I take it for granted, as long as no one objected, that it was the unanimous consent of the Chapter that the ballot should be spread, and therefore waiving the time.

3. Ques .- Can a member be elected to the office of Associate Matron. said member not being present in the Chapter room at the time of her election to said office?

Ans.--Yes, any member can be elected to an office without her presence in the Chapter room being necessary at that meeting.

4. Ques -- Can a person having had the degrees communicated to him by Rob Morris, and who never belonged to a chartered Chapter. affiliate with us?

Ans.-No; he must make application to a regular Chapter of the Order, pay his fees, be accepted and initiated like any other person.

5. Ques.-Can a member who has been elected to an office, and who refuses to be installed, have charges preferred against her?

Ans.-No, not for refusing to accept the office.

6. Ques -A Worthy Matron, elected last August, has never attended a meeting, and the old Matron does not want to fill the office any longer. Can we declare the chair vacant, and elect another Worthy Matron?

Ans.-No; if the Worthy Matron was installed after her election. you can not elect another and it is the duty of the Associate Matron to

preside during the absence of the Worthy Matron.

7. Ques.-Is a young lady not being born in wedlock, and not bearing her father's name, but who has been supported and claimed by him, eligible to receive the degrees?

Ans.—Yes, if applicant's father is a Mason in good standing, and a certificate from him recognizes her as his daughter, that is sufficient for

her to be eligible to the degrees.

8. Ques -A lady petitions the Chapter on the standing of her father (the only proof is that he was buried by the Masonic Lodge, and no papers to prove his standing in said lodge). Is she entitled to the Order of the Eastern Star degrees?

Ans .- No; unless she procures the necessary documents, she is not

eligible to the degrees.

9. Ques.—Is a widow of a Knight Templar, who was a dimitted Master Mason, and who intended presenting his dimit in a lodge, but who died before so doing, eligible to the Order of the Eastern Star degrees?

Ans,-No: as none but affiliated Masons and their female relatives are entitled.

10. Ques .- Is it permissible for Chapters to give public entertainments for the benefit of Chapters?

Ans.—There is no law in our Constitution prohibiting the same, therefore deem it permissible.

 Ones.—When there are several candidates to be initiated, can we give all the obligation, and then seat all but one, and let the others witness the initiation?

Ans. - No: every candidate must pass through the regular initiation

12. Oues. - Has the Worthy Matron or Worthy Patron the authority to ask for a dispensation for any purpose without a vote of the Chapter?

Ans - No.

13. Ques.-Can a young lady, raised by a Mason, bearing his name and considered as his daughter, although never legally adopted by him, be entitled to the Order of the Eastern Star degrees?

Ans -No-unless legally adopted,

14. Ones, -- Would a hallot be legal, if passed without black balls in the lax?

Ans. -- No -- the ballet would not be properly prepared.

15. Ones - Is the Worthy Matron allowed to take the Constitution and By-laws from the Chapter room?

Ans -- Yes -- she is expected to do so, and to make a study of them.

#### DEDICATION OF THE MASONIC TEMPLE AT WACO.

On December 6th, by invitation, I attended the dedication ceremonies of the Masonic Temple at Waco. There I found the ladies of W. E. Owens Chapter serving meals to visitors for the purpose of raising money for their plane fund, which under the guiding hand of their Worthy Matron, Sister Matteson, was a financial success. In the evening in company with Sister Matteson, Sister Bell, Sister Hill, Sister Johnson, the Associate Crand Conductress, Associate Crand Patron, Brother Orchard, Sister Flanders, Worthy Matron of Dallas Chapter, and Past Crand Patron Parks, we were treated to a lovely drive over the city by our Grand Patron, Brother Canon,

At 8:00 P. M. I attended the ceremonies of the dedication, where an

immense crowd was present.

The Grand Lodge is to be congratulated upon having such a handsome edifier for their home.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

As per the report of the Committee on Untinished Business in regard to the relief funds, which was adopted by the Grand Chapter at our last meeting, and in reference to this matter, not hearing from Brother W. S. Hoskins, on September 12th I addressed him the following communication under the scal of the Grand Chapter;

"Mr. W. S. Hoskins, Past Grand Patron, O. E. S., Houston, Texas,

"Dear Str and Brother .- At the last meeting of the Grand Chapter of the O. E. S. at Galveston, the following report, which you will find

on page 70 of this year's proceedings, was adopted:
"Inasmuch as Brother W. S. Hoskins has not submitted an itemized statement to this Grand Chapter of the disbursement of the relief funds in his hands, we fraternally request Brother Hoskins to submit such report to the incoming Grand Matron, that the records and books of this Grand Chapter may be relieved of this matter. It is expressly understood that the report of Brother Hoskins shall not be published in the proceedings. Fraternally submitted-Kate M. Bryan, Lillie Stubbs, W. M. Balaock, Committee,

"Therefore, as Grand Matron of the Order, I hereby fraternally request you to comply with the terms of said resolution, assuring you beforchand that all due consideration will be given the same.

No answer was received to my communication to Brother Hoskins.

March 10, 1905, extended Grand dimit to Sister Leona Ramsey of Detroit.

#### 600D OF THE ORDER.

The general interest shown in the endeavor to do better work in the Chapters throughout this jurisdiction is very gratifying, and is fully demonstrated by the extraordinary sale of rituals during this year. That which is more needed in our Chapters is a more perfect rendering of the ritual, also a more careful study of the By-laws of the Order, for what is worth doing at all is worth doing well. I am happy to report that in this respect we are making satisfactory progress.

I also bring a record of peace and harmony prevailing. This is certainly due to the application of the principles of our Order. A few exceptions lead me to mention that practically all of the troubles experi-

enced in some of the local Chapters spring from two sources;

1st-The election of officers,

2d-The rejection of petitions for membership.

The election of officers too often results in the disappointment of some aspiring member. To occupy the station faithfully and efficiently is worthy of the ambition of any of our members, but no one has a right to complain if not promoted, as the offices are the gift of the members of the Chapters.

The misuse of the ballot is another serious question; the blackball is too often unjustly used, thereby causing a great deal of ill feeling. I regret to say that in some few Chapters it is the means to redress personal grievances, real or fancied, and the Chapter struggles along, supported by a faithful few, while the spirit of rule or ruin possesses a certain faction. The ballot rightly used is a blessing; the ballot misused is a bane, a menace to our peace and prosperity. You can not subject a member to an inquisition as to how he votes in any case, but you can contribute to such a standard of conduct as to make it an occasion of shame for any one acting under personal prejudice in the use of the black ball.

I would admonish all members of the Order to practice more caution and secrecy in ballotting. Leave outside of the Chapter room all feelings of jealousy and hatred, thereby assuring the prosperity of your Chapter, where otherwise it would be a failure.

#### CONCLUSION.

The record of my year's work is before you. Whatever I have done during my stewardship in my official acts, has been done with honest convictions, and with an earnest desire to advance the interest of our Order.

I am pleased to day to look into the faces of so many who have helped to make my year one of pleasure and profit. As I submit this record of the year's work for your criticisms or approval, I have one proud satisfaction, and that is, that every duty has been discharged to the best of my ability. During this year I have given up all of my time to the Order of the Eastern Star, and have endeavored to promote its welfare. The ad-

dition of lifty-two new stars to our constellation, of which I have organized fourteen myself, and having officially visited eighty Chapters, has not been actiont some labor. The correspondence of this office has kept pace with the increase in Chapters and members. I have written 1764 letters, traceled 4802 miles by rail, and 400 miles in private conveyances and mail coaches. While sometimes I became discouraged and disheartened, yet the many kind words and loving acts of the members have spurred me on to work that much harder, that I would, as Ruth, bring in some sheaves to show to you, sisters and brothers, how much I appreciated the honor you bestowed upon me one year ago.

My relations with the Grand officers have been of the most pleasant character, and whatever success we have attained is the result of the

united efforts of officers and members.

I desire to extend to our Grand Patron, Brother Canon, my sincere appreciation for his support and wise counsel. The Grand Chapter made no

eastake in selecting him for this high position.

To the Grand Secretary, words are inadequate to express my thanks. She has been ever ready to help, and always prompt. She has deemed no labor too great to promote the welfare of our Order; ably and well has she performed the duties of her office.

To Past Grand Matron, Sister Garrison, and Past Grand Patron, frother Garrison, I owe a debt of gratitude. Many times in trying mo-

ments have they helped me cross the rough and rugged paths.

To those Deputies who so efficiently aided me, I offer my thanks, more especially to Sister Fannie V. Ward, who has so nobly responded to all my strikes and alone has organized nine Chapters, besides taking care of all the Chapters on the Texas Pacific Railroad without expense to the Chapter.

To Sister Rimmer, I also owe many thanks.

I cannot close without a word to the members of my own Chapter, Dallas No. 1. Many kind expressions of interest and love have helped to anoth the rough places and made the cold side of steep inclines more my to ascend. My sisters and brothers of Dallas No. 1 "live close to the robbest ideals," and they have proven that the little deeds of kindness made life one long, sweet song.

Very soon the honors which I now bear will be assumed by another, and I trust she will find the same joyous welcome, the same harmony mong the members that I have found. May the Star of Light from above

is in item her path, and guide her through a successful year.

Sisters and brothers, my work is done. The time has come for me to an under the gavel, the emblem of authority; and as I am about to retire the office, I wish to express once more my heartfelt thanks to the member of the Order for the many courtesies and acts of kindness you have used to me during my term of administration.

The Grand Chapter was then treated to the following address by E. C. Canon, Grand Patron:

## ADDRESS OF GRAND PATRON.

To the Grand Matron, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star of Texas;

We are come, now, to the accounting of our stewardship, to the reckning with you for the trust committed to air care one year agone. The end of the year recounts to our minds the successes and pleasures, the failures and disappointments of the twelve mouths so swiftly passed. From the report of the Grand Matron and her work so full and replete with successes, we are made to realize that this is truly the Golden October harvest time when we are met to eajoy the fruition of the hope cherished in the past for successful achievement and an administration of the affairs of this Grand Chapter which would credit the pages of its reports and lend a measure of confidence to its future. We are met to recount our experiences and give account of our official acts touching the welfare and government of the Order, and to consult and advise with each other on measures looking to a continuance of that prosperity which now attends us.

Upon being elected Grand Patron one year ago, I had to say to you that I was humbled at your fect, a thankful and grateful servant, whose aim should ever be to so conduct myself and the affairs entrusted to my care in such a manner as that I should have the consciousness within of duty well done—to the end that I should hand back to you this exalted office untarnished by misrule or arbitrary conduct. It is in the spirit of this declaration that I beg to hand you herewith this my report as your

Grand Patron for the year now closed.

Realizing as I did the added responsibilities and duties of the Grand Patron, occasioned by the adoption of the new Constitution and laws of the Order last year, making it his duty to pass upon legal questions, discipline, etc.. I entered into the work with the hope that by careful preparation and study I might be enabled to advise the Grand Matron properly and to the best interest of the Order on such questions and matters about which she might ask my advice and assistance, and to properly construct the laws of our Order for the guidance of the subordinate Chapters under our new Constitution, as that there might be eliminated any confusion as to their proper construction; therefore, to that part of this report touching our laws, I invite your careful and thoughtful consideration.

At this time I must acknowledge the many marks of honor and respect shown me by members of the Order in this State and in other States during the year, evidenced by a great number of invitations to attend special meetings of Chapters, and by many personal letters. The great majority of which meetings to which I was invited I was not so fortunate as to be able, to attend, but I am certain those who extended such cordial invitations know of my appreciation and will accept my gratitude and fraternal

greeting.

I, also, in this connection wish to say that early in the year I was honored with a commission from the Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of Arkansas as the Representative of that Grand Chapter to the Grand Chapter of Texas, which I acknowledged, expressing the assurance that both myself and all the Grand officers of Texas would be at all times glad to exchange ideas and promote social intercourse between the two sister Grand Chapters.

My correspondence has been quite voluminous during the year and I have written a great many letters of more or less importance, but with a recital of the most of which I deem it unnecessary to burden this report; but in some instances I present my full replies to queries submitted because of the questions raised and passed upon, the questions in each instance being repeated in my letters, making it unnecessary to quote the letter of inquiry also.

#### WORLD'S PAIR FRATERNAL FUND.

On March 2, 1905, in responce to a letter from the Grand Matron anent the disposition of the 20 per cent left on hand of the St. Louis Exposition Fraternal Fund. I wrote her that in my judgment about all that we could do for the Lewis-Clark Exposition (the Executive Board of the Order having asked us for contributions for this exposition), was to agree that said Executive Board should use our pro-rata share of 20 per cent left on hand as our contribution to this cause. I also had to say that I did not think it right to ask the subordinate Chapters to contribute to this final; that it would be a demand they would think unnecessary; but that in my judgment this Grand Chapter would approve her action in in tracting the use of this balance in that way.

#### DUPLICATE CHARTERS.

On May 29, 1005, I signed a duplicate charter for Miami Chapter torwarded to me by the Grand Matron, which after endorsing and signing I forwarded to Miami Chapter, their charter having been destroyed by fire.

On July 31, 1905. I signed a duplicate charter for Burke Chapter No. 190, at Burke, Angelina County, which the Grand Matron had issued to this Chapter on account of loss of their charter by fire, and forwarded

ame to Burke Chapter.

OFFICIAL CIRCULAR NO. 1. FROM OPPICE OF M. W. GRAND MATRON, AND CORRESPONDENCE RELATIVE THERETO, AND CIRCULAR LETTER FROM GRAND OFFICERS OF TEXAS.

Early in this year I received from the office of the M. W. Grand Matron of the General Grand Chapter "Official Circular No. 1," about which I have had some correspondence which I deem proper to state, as fellows:

Austin, July 26, 1905.

"Mrs. Amelia Huvelle, Grand Matron O. E. S., Dallas, Texas,

"Dear Sister Huvelle—I suppose you received some time ago tonicial Circular No. 1' from the office of the M. W. Grand Matron, Mr. Madeleine B. Conkling, in which she enumerates three powers with which the General Grand Chapter is clothed and over which it has complete control, viz: Control of Ritual, Qualification of Membership, and the Landmarks of the Order; and in which circular letter she calls the control of the Grand officers of the respective Grand Chapters attention of the Grand officers of the respective Grand Chapters attention to everal errors which have crept into the ritual, some in one Grand for ediction and some, of course, in others. If you received this circular and noted what the M. W. Grand Matron had to say therein, you dealthess noticed that in our jurisdiction we are accustomed to do some those things which run counter to her rulings, to wit:

First—The collection of a pass from the members at the opening of Chapter. On page 58 of our Constitution and laws, Grand Matron Albord, in 1899, ruled that 'any one of the degree passes may be used in training a Chapter in place of the cabbalistic word, thereby indicating, of carse, that to use either would be correct. Now, what do you think of '18? We are bound to follow the ritual of the General Grand Chapter, that ritual I do not find the authority for Grand Matron Alvord's rong. I take it that this practice grew in this jurisdiction because of the language of the ritual, page 17, 'ascertain and report if all present in members of the Order,' using the taking of a pass as a means of certaining that fact. I am of the opinion, and was before I had seen "118 circular, that the proper way to do is to be able to youch for all the sent, by having sat in Chapter with them, or let the visiting member

for whom no one might be able to youch be examined by a committee and then admitted, and to dispense with the taking up of a pass at all

"Second-The use of the square and compass upon the altar is discussed and the practice condemned, for reasons as stated by her. On page 57 of our laws you will find that Grand Matron Young, in 1901, states that these instruments should be placed upon the Bible for the reason that it is the badge of the Worthy Patron. Now, of course, the "five-pointed star with square and compasses in the center" is the badge of the Worthy Patron, which is worn by him when at his station but not the Masonic implements which are used by the Masonic lodge However, I do not think that it is worth while to disturb this practice either one way or the other, unless it might be that to 'borrow too much plumage might work to our gradual disadvantage. But it would be a practice very easily discarded in this jurisdiction, for the reason not very much stress is put on it anyway. What do you think about it?

Third-Landmark No. 8 is especially spoken of as being sometime. violated; but this I think is almost uniformly regarded in our State "The General Grand officers seek to promulgate some orders with reference to New York and New Jersey, which are included in this letter.

to which I call your attention

"It seems that in some of the States this Circular Letter No. 1 has created quite an interest in some particulars.

"Trusting it will not burden you too much to go into these matters

The Circular Letter No. 1, above referred to was discussed at some length by Grand Matron Huvelle and myself, and her recommendations regarding same, if any, are of course in her report. This Circular Letter No. 1 is referred to by the Grand Matron, in a letter to me of date August 22, 1905, as follows: "I found along my route that it was creating dissension in a good many Chapters, some deeming it law, and wishing to do away with the square and compasses, others contending to the contrary. I think it is time to set the Chapters right in this matter." and in this communication the Grand Matron asked me to prepare an article to be published in the Texas Freemason touching upon the supremiey of the laws of this jurisdiction, etc., which I did, as follows.

To the Chapters and Members of the Order of the Eastern Star in Texas. "By reacon of Circular Letter No. 1, sent out from the office of the Most Worthy Grand Matron, and a communication from Most Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Kuhn, in a recent issue of the Texas Freemason there has arisen quite a great deal of confusion in different parts of the State relative to the construction to be given by local Chapters to these communications in as far as they may affect the rules of government and usiges and practices of the Order in this State. Because of this confusion and uncertainty among many Chapters, it is thought advisable to say to all members of the Order in Texas, and to all local Chapters in this Grand Jurisdiction, that the Grand Chapter of Texas is supreme in all its affairs, and the government of the Order in this State is solely dependent upon it, and none other. The Constitution and By-laws. rules and regulations, of this Grand Chapter constitute the laws by which we are governed, and no Chapter nor individual member has any right nor power to make any change in our established practices as faid down in our laws and regulations and as promulgated by our Grand officers until such change or variance is authorized by the Grand Chapter through its proper officers."

#### DECISIONS.

1. Divorce and Re-marriage.—In response to a letter from Worthy Patron of Bright Star Chapter No. 65 at Longview, I gave the following "The case in point, as you state is as follows: 'A lady member of your Chapter was divorced from her husband, and the Court restored her maiden name. Six weeks afterwards she was again married, to a man who is not a Mason. She has her dues paid, is in good standing, and wants to remain in good standing.' You ask my ruling as to her status, and how you shall proceed?

"First-The lady in question was initiated and received the degrees at the time, and during the time she was a Master Maioa's wife, and was because of that fact eligible. Her subsequent divorce from her hasband does not vitiate her obligation nor sever her membership in the Order. She is still a member and can remain a member in good standing so long as she pays her dues and is not expelled or suspended for some other reason than the mere fact of having been divorced from her former husband.

'Second—You also state that her first husband has since married, and that his second wife wants to apply for the decrees. Now, of course, of the man is a Mason in good standing, his second wife is entitled to the degrees, if acceptable to the Chapter to which she applies. Her reception would be a matter for the Chapter to pass on by ballot should she apply.

2. Jurisdiction; New Ballot Ordered When .- A brother and his wife petitioned Red Rose Chapter No. 104, and were elected to receive the degrees, in February, 1904, but they did not appear to be initiated until June 15, 1905: "Should a new application be required or a new ballot be had?" The principle as contained in Article 441 of Masonie has obtains in our Chapter, and in such a case, where the candidate hals to receive the degrees within twelve months after being elected, when the applicant does apply to receive the degrees, a new ballot should be ordered. This, however, should not be confused with the doctrine and principle of "Perpetual Jurisdiction"; i. e., where a candidate is covered by a Chapter, the Chapter so rejecting such candidate retains a restual jurisdiction over him until waived. Nor should this rule be confused with the law of the Order of the Eastern Star which says that, when a candidate is elected to receive the degrees and moves out of the purisdiction of the Chapter so electing him, such Chapter retains absolute provide tion over such candidate for twelve months and no longer. You

will readily see the distinctions.

3. Time limit to Charter Member's Initiation; Disposition of Fees Paid--Mrs. B. signed the petition for dispensation to organize a Chapthat Chillicothe and paid her part of the charter fees, \$1,50. When the Capter was organized and set to work, she had no legal proof that she was entitled to receive the degrees, consequently was not allowed to be mitted. The Chapter was organized in March, 1904. In July, 1905, succeeded in getting and presented "legal proof," and asked to be ustrated as a charter member. You ask if this can be done? And if can the \$1.50 originally paid by Mrs. B. be credited to her as a part payment of her regular initiation fee; and, you further ask whether you and have to charge her the regular initiation fee? After twelve months slighted from date of organizing the Chapter, any person, whose name adjears on the petition for dispensation as a charter member and who b. not been obligated or initiated, has by such lapse of time been barred a taking advantage of such charter membership, and would have to postion the Chapter as would any other candidate. As to the fee, you of course, have to charge her the same as any other, that is the to dar fee. However, she having assisted those of you who were ena-16 ! to be obligated at the time of organizing the Chapter to pay for dispensation, supplies, etc., by her \$1.50, it would be but right and 30 der, since she has been in good faith all the time in trying to become a trimber, for the Chapter to refund to her the \$1.50, and let her in this may not have the double burden of paying a charter fee and initiation 🖖 also.

4 Installing Officer.—Query from Red Rose Chapter No. 104: "Can a Chapter vote for the Past Worthy Matron to install the officers for the ensuing year, or should the outgoing Matron install?" It would be perfectly legal and proper for either a Past Matron or the outgoing Matron of the Chapter to install the new officers. There should be no preference by teason of seniority of service and membership, but the convenience and pleasure of the officers selected or proposed and the wish of the Chapter should govern you in this matter.

5. On Supremacy of our Laws as regards Subordinate Chapters. On August 19, 1905, I had occasion to write the following in answer to a communication from Harmony Chapter No. 244 at El Paso, which you will notice has considerable bearing on the subject above discussed under the head of "Circular Letter No. 1," My reply being: "From your letter I gather that one or more of your members are insisting on changing the rules and regulations of your Chapter to conform to the expressions as sent out from the Most Worthy Grand Matron's office, rather than to conform to the By-laws and Constitution of our Grand Chapter and the rulings given by our Grand Matrons in the government of the Order in this State. \* \* \* I will state the following as a broad and certain proposition, to wit: This Grand Jurisdiction is supreme in all its affairs. and the Chapters in this jurisdiction, and the individual members of the Order, are subject only to the By-laws and Constitution, rules and regulations of this Grand Chapter and none other, and must conform to such by-laws, rules and regulations and the interpretations given thereto by the Grand officers. The matter of our conforming or not conforming to any edict or suggestion rule or regulation, of the General Grand Chapter is a matter for the Grand Chapter to remedy, if need be, and until such change is authorized by the Grand Chapter through its proper officers, no subordinate Chapter nor individual member has any authority to make any variance from our usual regulations.

6. Attempted Exposure of the Ballot, Insubordination, Circulating Petition among Members Unlawefully.—On June 6, 1905, the Worthy Patron of Oak Grove Chapter No. 205 at Plantersville addressed to me a letter setting forth a statement of facts upon which he asked my advice, which matters and acts so set forth herein I consider of very great importance on the question of insubordination, improper petition and misconduct, and which facts are set forth fully in the following correspondence.

"Austin, Texas, June 10, 1905.

"Mil. T. J. Tuckas, Worthy Patron Oak Grove Chapter No. 205, O. E. S. Plantersville, Teras.

\*\*Dear Sir and Brother—Your letter to me of date June 6th reached me on yesterday, having been forwarded to me from Waco In your letter you relate conditions upon which you ask me to advise you as follows:

"1. At your last regular meeting an applicant for the degrees being a Master Mason and husband of one of your members, was rejected his petition. Committee report thereon and ballot all being regular.

his petition, Committee report thereon and ballot all being regular.

"2. On the 5th day of June, 1905, after such rejection, the wife of the rejected petitioner, together with another sister, a member of your Chapter, circulated a petition and induced certain members to sign same, asking that an investigation be had of said rejection, which petition set forth the allegation that the rejection of the candidate was on personal grounds, and that the character of the applicant, and of his wife also, was greatly injured by such rejection, and also contained other strong language.

"3. You also say that the Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron, when advised of said petition, admonished the sister, wife of rejected

equieant, that such action in circulating such petition was wrong and a collation of the principles of our Order, but that, notwithstanding year advice and protest of such action, the said sister remarked that he would go ahead and 'if she was expelled she did not give a continuatal.'

Now, relative to such conduct on the part of a member of the coder, I wish to say that the facts and conditions as above stated constitute gross misconduct on the part of such member. Her attempt to expore the ballot should meet with the disapproval and censure of your chapter as being a direct and intentional infringement and violation of the laws of the Order. And her persistence in doing this wrong thing after she was told by the officers of the Chapter that it was wrong, and we shown the law itself, shows a spirit of insubordination which can red be tolerated. To sum up the situation, there is not yet an actual the closure of the ballot, so that that charge can not be brought; but only an insubordination and wil ful violation of the laws of the Order relating to the secrecy of the ballot, which, if permitted to exist in a tharter, would work its utter destruction.

The members of your Chapter who signed the petition asking for an investigation of said rejection also erred in joining in such action. They, however, I am persuaded, were not fully advised as to the extent of the wrong they were doing. However, as to them, I would advise you, that you advise them in open Chapter of the evil effects of any itempt to expose the ballot, and adminish them never to be guilty it even encouraging such an attempt by word or act. From your letter I can not gather whether the sister who went with and assisted the ane of the rejected applicant in getting up the petition was equally gulty with her in the matter or not, and will leave her case with you and the Chapter to determine.

"As to the sister complained of, the wife of the rejected candidate, I advise that you proceed to reprimand her in open Chapter at a regular meeting for her unbecoming conduct as a member of the Order, in that she willfully and knowingly violated the laws and regulations of the Order in attempting to inquire into the ballot had upon the application of her husband, and did so knowing it was a violation. In this connotion I further advise that her conduct, as set forth in paragraphs one two and three above, was such as that the Chapter would be justited in expelling her from the Order or suspending her, as in your judgnort, or rather the judgment of the Chapter, may seem best and suffiand, in the event she persists in being obstinate in her course. 1 will not be subservient to the rules and laws of the Order, and will · · be governed by the advise of the officers of the Chapter, and you sider a reprimand as first above suggested is not sufficient, then, is that case, it would be your duty to prefer charges against said memin proper form, and either expel or suspend her from your Chap-

I sent a carbon copy of the above letter on the same day to the Grand ron, and she on the next day, June 11th, forwarded to me the letter i petition of the sister above referred to, which she had just received. I ressed to her as Grand Matron, asking that she cause an investigation with ballot and rejection to be had, requesting that I attend to the ter, stating that she concurred in my statements made in copy of r. I had sent her. The petition and letter set forth substantially allegations as are enumerated above in my letter to the Worthy ron, and need not be again repeated. I then wrote the following ther to the sister in question, in response to her letter and petition:

"Austin, June 14, 1905.

Your letter, dated June 6, 1905, together with a petition signed vourself and several members of Oak Grove Chapter No. 205, O. E. S.,

addressed to the Grand Matron, Sister Amelia Huvelle, has been by her

referred to me for reply and consideration.

"In the first place, I will have to say that the object sought by the petition, that is, to have an investigation of the ballot and the reasons for the rejection of the candidate by some one or more of your members exposed and the reasons for such objection to the candidate made public is one that can not be entertained. The divulging the name of a rejected candidate is an offense punishable by expulsion from the Order; and the secreey of the ballot is one of the cardinal principles of the Order that can not at any time, nor for any reason, be infringed upon To cause an investigation of a secret ballot taken in open Chapter and expose the member who east it, would be a most flagrant violation of this law. Therefore, in reply to your letter, and said petition, I must say that it is improper and must decline to consider same."

I then advised the sister of the advice I had given the Worthy Patron of her Chapter on the subject, and admonished her to go before the Chapter in regular meeting and make amends for her action and coaduct

I afterwards had several other letters in regard to this matter from the Worthy Patron, and on July 3, 1905, I had a letter from him to the effect that nearly all of the members who signed the petition with the sister in question had come before the Chapter in person and, by written statement, acknowledging their mistake and wrong, disayowing any intentional wrongdoing, were very promptly excused by the Chapter for their action in the premises, and the Worthy Patron stated that the matter he felt would be fully adjusted within a very short while. But, as to whether the sister complained of has made amends for her conduct and is in good standing or not in Oak Grove Chapter, I have not been able to learn; and therefore, I would ask the committee to whom this matter may be referred to inquire into this feature of the case of the representative of Oak Grove Chapter, if in attendance at the Grand Chapter, and make such recommendations thereabout as may seem proper.

have answered many other questions relating to the laws of the Order during the year, most of which were fundamental and primary. and could be answered by direct reference to the laws, so that I deem it not advisable to further burden this report with those matters.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS.

On page 45 of our Constitution and By-laws the following paragraph introductory to Revised Decisions of Grand Officers, is found:

"The following decisions of Grand Officers be, and they are hereby made a part of this Constitution, and shall be known as Section 22 of Article 1 of Rules and Regulations for the government of Subordi-

nate Chapters."

The above paragraph appears as a resolution, which, upon the adoption of this present Constitution, was adopted and made, as is therein stated, the decisions of the Grand officers a part of the Constitution and designated them, as a whole, as a particular section of an "Article of the Rules and Regulations." Now, in my judgment, the insertion of this preliminary resolution above quoted into this Constitution and By laws of the Grand Chapter is a mistake, and one which gives unwarranted force and effect to such decisions and interpretations of the law by such Grand officers, and should be, in my judgment, by this Grand Chapter eliminated. The decisions of the Grand officers of this Grand Chapter are of full force and are binding as between the parties affected thereby until such ruling or decision, or opinion, is reversed by the Grand Chapter. And any Chapter or member has the right to appeal from such decisions, opinions or rulings to the Grand Chapter. Thereture it would not seem that any such decision should be given that weightier force of having been, by reason of its being made by a Grand affect as it were read into the Constitution itself, to amend which reentires the greater difficulty of affecting such amendment than a simple reversal in the Grand Chapter session. And, further, the decisions following such preliminary paragraph were made under former conditions and were made under a former Constitution, and I doubt very seriously if this Grand Chapter really intended to make such decisions as so laid down, and as made under a former Constitution, a part and parcel of this present Constitution; but I rather believe the same to have crept into this Constitution, as it is arranged and placed inadvertently and authout the proper thought as to its effect. I, therefore, submit for Your consideration my suggestion that this Grand Chapter consider the matter, and I recommend that by suitable resolution and procedure our Constitution and By-laws be amended so as to eliminate this paragraph above quoted.

I wish to state that my relations with the Grand Matron and with her deputies have been most cordial, indeed. This Grand Chapter, I an sure, fully appreciates the great amount of labor and work and the splendid report resultant therefrom of Grand Matron, Sister Amelia fluvelle. Her deputies throughout the State have done splendid sersice and especially have some of them excelled in zeal, and assisted very materially in gleaning the sheaves for the Grand Matron's splendid report. In this connection I wish to make especial mention of Sister Jennie Rimmer, of San Saba, Grand Esther and Deputy Grand Matron. who by her tireless zeal and efforts only a few days since was enabled to report the organization of Austin Chapter at Austin. It, to me, was a very befitting close of the year's work, for it was a source of satisfaction to me to see a Chapter organized at Austin. It was my pleasure to be with her and assist her in this work, and I am gratified to say that Austin is now wide-awake in Eastern Star work.

It is very natural and commendable for the officers of the Grand Chapter to be anxious and strive to institute many new Chapters during that respective terms of office. However, it is my judgment that it s vastly more important in this Grand Jurisdiction now, that the Chapters over the State already at work should be fostered, and the principles of the Order more fully and more frequently explained and promulgated, and proper light disseminated, than that we should strive to very materi-

ally increase the number of our subordinate Chapters.

The memory of my pleasant associations with the officers and membets of this Grand Chapter will ever be a priceless heritage to me, and in the future, as we go along, I shall consider it a privilege to work for the unbuilding of our Order with a riper experience and better judgment. and shall always consider myself prepaid by the many courtesies and ky lly attentions received during my past terms of office.

A board of five Trustees was appointed to raise funds and take charge of all matters pertaining to the erection of a Masonic and Eastern Star Home, and an additional per capita tax of 25 cents was levied to aid in the work. A committee appointed conveyed to the Grand Lodge A. F. and A. M. the willingness of the Order of the Eastern Star to give assistance, both moral and financial, towards the establishment of a Home, and we are glad to know that this action on their part was received with proper consideration and recognition, and that the Order of the Eastern Star is to have representation on the board of management of said Home, when completed.

The Grand Secretary reports that out of one hundred and forty-seven Chapters, one hundred have made returns and eighty-four have

paid dues.

Grand Treasurer reports total receipts for the year, \$2037.42; dis-

bursements, \$1365.27; balance, \$672.15.

The first pages are embelished with the portraits of the Grand Matron and Grand Patron. The volume is neatly bound and well-printed. A committee of three presents a very interesting review. Texas very kindly reviewed.

# CALIFORNIA.

The thirty-second annual communication was held in San Francisco, October 18, 19, 20 and 21, 1904. Representatives of one hundred and sixty-four Chapters, thirteen Grand officers, forty-six Past Grand officers and fifteen District Deputies were present.

This beautiful, well-arranged and well-printed volume appears in a dress of white, with a tinted front cover and an entiblematic star in the center of same. It is further adorned with splendid half-tones of the retiring Grand Matron and Grand Patron, both of which plainly indicate that the affairs of the Grand Chapter were in excellent hands.

Here the Grand Patron still presides. In this Grand Chapter they reverse the general order of things, as the Past Grand Patron calls the session to order and the address of Grand Patron is delivered first and contains much that we are accustomed to find in the Grand Matron's report. In the address of Grand Patron, Brother Geo. F. McNoble, he urges the publication of a paper within the State and says the work is so great that he found it necessary to use a clerk, and thinks that both Grand Matron and Grand Patron should be provided with such help. He was asked to decide on the "color line," and says that colored people are not eligible.

The Grand Matron appointed twenty-four Deputy Grand Matrons, installed the first corps of officers of seven Chapters (under commission from the Grand Patron). She granted thirty-five dispensations, five being to receive petitions under six months' residence, six to receive and act upon petitions the same evening, and eighteen to re-ballot, signed dispensations for seven charters. Many schools of instruction were held. Fifty-four pages of her report comprises the reports of her Deputies,

which show great good accomplished.

An excellent report is given by the Grand Secretary, Mrs. Kate Willats, who has served this Grand Chapter in said capacity for twenty-two years. She tells us that one Chapter has a membership of over 500, two of over 400 and two of over 300. The greatest gain in membership during the year was made by Mission Chapter No. 155, being eighty-five members.

Chapters, 188; members, 18,666; gain, 2162. Home Fund, \$623.55. Cash on hand, \$9295.35.

The fraternal correspondence is from the able pen of Mrs. Clara Abbott Giberson. Texas receives mention.

Many distinguished visitors were present, who, with twenty-three Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons were presented, escorted to the East and accorded the Grand Honors. A most enjoyable pilgrimage was made to the Masonic Home, where a sumptuous repast was spread, and the building inspected under the

guidance of the children.

Sister Ethel Stansbury, Worthy Matron of a local Chapter, gave an eloquent address of welcome. A sympathetic response was given by

Sister Linda J. Sears, Associate Grand Matron.

The address of the Grand Matron, who is both young and elever, is an excellent production, showing the enthusiasm of youth combined with a study of the needs of the Order. She had the courage of her convictions to refuse all requests for dispensations to railroad candidates into the Order.
